### THE FACTS

- The total cost of construction is estimated to be approximately **\$7.1 million**.
- Currently, the parish has **\$2.5 million** in cash available for this program from prior fundraising efforts and insurance funds.
- St. Michael the Archangel Parish is embarking on the second phase of an ambitious campaign to raise an additional **\$2.8 million** needed to make these plans a reality.
- Current pledges **\$1.8 million**.
